ELECTION, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLES 28 TO 34 OF THE INTERNATIONAL COVENANT ON CIVIL AND POLITICAL RIGHTS, OF ONE MEMBER OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS COMMITTEE TO FILL THE VACANCY CREATED BY THE RESIGNATION OF MR. WALTER KÄLIN (SWITZERLAND) WHOSE TERM WAS TO EXPIRE ON 31 DECEMBER 2010

# Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. In conformity with article 34 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, the Twenty-second Meeting of States Parties to the Covenant will be convened by the Secretary-General at United Nations Headquarters on Monday, 28 July 2008, for the purpose of filling one vacancy in the Human Rights Committee.
- 2. In a letter dated 8 April 2008, Mr. Walter Kälin (Switzerland), who was re-elected at the Twenty-fifth Meeting of States Parties to the Covenant held on 6 September 2006 for a term that was to expire on 31 December 2010, submitted his resignation from the Committee with immediate effect. In a letter dated 18 April 2008, the Chairperson of the Human Rights Committee informed the Secretary-General accordingly.
- 3. Pursuant to article 33, paragraph 2, and article 34, paragraph 1, of the Covenant, the Secretary-General declared the seat of Mr. Kälin vacant from the date of his resignation. By note verbale of 15 May 2008, the States parties to the Covenant were invited to submit nominations, by 15 July 2008, for the purpose of filling the vacancy for a term expiring on 31 December 2010.
